

## **Airport Coordination Limited**

### **The Airports Slot Allocation Regulation 2006**

#### **Notice of Financial Penalty to be paid by**

**Air India for repeatedly and intentionally operating an aircraft in significantly different way to that indicated at the time of allocation on 11 dates between 23 June 2016 and 17 July 2016, inclusive.**

Airport Coordination Limited (ACL), as the appointed coordinator for Heathrow Airport has the responsibility, inter alia, for the administration of the Misuse of Slots Enforcement Code 2007 (the Code), implemented at coordinated airports in the UK on 1 January 2007 in accordance with the Airport Slot Allocation Regulations 2006 (the UK Regulations).

ACL gave Air India a Notice of Final Decision on 23 January 2017 which notified Air India that pursuant to Regulation 16 of the UK Regulations, ACL had decided to impose a financial penalty on Air India in respect of Air India's repeated and intentional breach of regulation 14 of the UK Regulations which occurred on 11 dates between 23 June 2016 and 17 July 2016, inclusive.

Accordingly, ACL has imposed a financial penalty on Air India in the amount of £88,000.

Air India is aware that further operations in a significantly way from that indicated at the time of allocation may result in further financial penalties being applied.
